### Motivation Letter

The motivation letter plays an important role in your application. It allows you to tell us why you want to take our programme and helps us assess your suitability.

#### Your motivation letter must provide an answer to the following questions:

1. Why do you want to study Philosophy?
2. Why do you want to pursue your studies at the University of Luxembourg?

### Attention! Remember to:

- indicate your full name and Personal Identifier (number) issued by the University of Luxembourg during your online application.
- write your motivation letter in either French, German or English.
- make sure you check your motivation letter for language errors before you submit it.
- make sure your motivation letter is between 600 and 750 words. Letters that exceed this limit will be disqualified.

### A note on AI

Please be aware that it is extremely important for you to formulate the ideas and arguments in your motivation letter yourself. The motivation letter gives you the opportunity to detail your personal expectations and goals.

If you decide to use a chatbot to help with your letter, you will have to credit it as a source in a footnote (respect for intellectual property). Do not forget: chatbots mimic human speech and will produce “answers” that will seem “the most acceptable” to a majority of people; it will not make your application stand out.

Please consider this seriously as you write your motivation letter – its purpose is to determine whether the Bachelor en Cultures Européennes is right for you!
