BIOGRAPHIES OF KEYNOTE SPEAKERS AND PANELISTS

Jonathan Berk

Jonathan Berk is the A.P. Giannini Professor of Finance at the Graduate School of Business, Stanford University. His research covers a broad range of topics in finance, including delegated money management; the pricing of financial assets; valuing a firm's growth potential; the capital structure decision; the interaction between labor markets and financial markets; impact investing and professional regulation. He received his PhD in finance from Yale University. Before joining Stanford, he was the Sylvan Coleman Professor of Finance at Haas School of Business at the University of California, Berkeley.

Caroline Flammer

Caroline Flammer is a Professor of International and Public Affairs and of Climate at Columbia University with joint appointments at the School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) and the Climate School. Caroline is an expert in sustainable investing and the recipient of numerous prestigious awards. Her research examines whether and how sustainable finance and impact investing can help finance a more sustainable world. Among other roles, Caroline serves as the President of the Alliance for Research on Corporate Sustainability (ARCS), a global multi-disciplinary network of scholars fostering rigorous academic.

Jean-Marc Di Cato

Jean-Marc Di Cato has a long-standing experience in the Luxembourg financial sector: He is the Chief Risk Officer of Clearstream Holding and held roles at McKinsey & Company and Banque de Luxembourg. He has a particular interest in ESG topics across risk and regulation, product opportunities and corporate social responsibility. Jean-Marc studied business and international law at Paris-Sorbonne University and holds an MBA from NYU Stern School of Business.
