	We explore the effect of population ageing on the environment by proposing a novel classification of environmental outcomes according to popular engage- ment, hence resulting in two distinct categories: action-requiring environmen- tal outcomes and nature-regarding environmental outcomes. Using regression analysis on cross-country data over the 1996-2018 period, our findings reveal that whilst ageing has a pro-ecological impact on nature-concerning environ- mental outcomes, it has a anti-ecological effect on action-requiring ones. Upon careful analysis of survey data, we also find evidence for contextual effects of population ageing on individual attitudes towards the environment regarding engagement for the environment	
	Population Ageing, the Composition of Government Expenditure, and Economic Growth – Theory and Evidence (with A. Irmen and J. Kuehnel)	

	We investigate the impact of population ageing on economic growth through the composition of government expenditure. The theoretical analysis posits that ageing gives rise to an older median voter which, under majority vot- ing, results in higher spending on the elderly and leaves productive expendi- ture unchanged; in addition to halting the economy's growth rate by crowding out private investments. These predictions were tested empirically. First, we applied OLS and IV regression analyses on a sample of OECD countries and demonstrated that whilst population ageing has a positive and significant ef- fect on old age spending categories, it has no effect on productive expenditure counterparts. Second, we studied a larger sample of 178 countries and also found that elderly spending results in slower economic growth
