This work examines the legal regime of consumer obligations through the lens of prescription (statutory limitation periods). It explores how consumer law — inherently imbalanced due to unequal party dynamics — integrates prescription as a mechanism from general obligation regimes. Key issues addressed in the research include the impact of amicable negotiations on statutes of limitation, and the legal implications and consequences of paying a time-barred debt within the context of consumer law.

The study of accessible case law and available pre-litigation mechanisms reveals that the consumer is disadvantaged in two respects:

- The application of general legal mechanisms (calculation, interruption, suspension, substitution of time limits, and presumptive payment prescription) effectively grants professionals control over time limits, whether acting as creditors or debtors.
- The coexistence of multiple statutes of limitation with differing natures and regimes (prescription, presumptive prescription, and foreclosure) creates confusion for both parties and the courts.

The comparison of jurisprudential trends among courts of appeal in mass litigation highlights opposing practices which, beyond the significant economic stakes for consumers, deprive them of equal access to justice. The demonstration of imbalances caused by the prescription regime is accompanied by forward-looking reflections.
