Susana Muñoz is a Maître-assistant at the Faculty of Law, Economics and Finance (FDEF) at the University of Luxembourg. She holds a PhD in Law from the Universidad Pública de Navarra (Pamplona, Spain), where she started her research career in public international law and European law within a University Professorship Training Programme.

After gaining professional experience at the European Parliament's Directorate General for Research, in 1998 she joined the European Navigator (ENA) research and innovation project as a researcher in European integration law in the Centre d'études et de recherches européennes Robert Schuman, Luxembourg. In 2002 she was a founding member of the Centre Virtuel de la Connaissance sur l'Europe (CVCE), a public institution under the supervision of the Luxembourg Ministry of Higher Education and Research, where she became Head of European Integration Studies and a Member of the Management Committee. On 1 July 2016, the CVCE joined the University of Luxembourg and she was leading the European Integration Studies Group within the Digital European Integration Studies (DEIS) research infrastructure until June 2017. She joined the Department of Law at the FDEF in July 2017.

Her research, publications and expertise are cross-disciplinary, ranging from public international law and European law to interdisciplinary European integration studies using ICT-based methods and tools. Her current activities include teaching EU constitutional and institutional law, EU internal market, EU competition law, EU health law and Luxembourg social security law in FDEF bachelor, master and doctoral education programmes. She leads the University of Luxembourg's Moot Court Programme, a cross-cutting programme of experiential education on legal writing and oral advocacy in various areas of law, including the participation of FDEF master students in European and international moot court competitions. Her research is focused on fundamental social rights in Europe, environmental justice and EU health law and policy.
