The call number is composed of two parts: an alphabetical code and a numerical code. The alphabetical code identifies the main class the book refers to. There are six main classes: A (General Works); B (Countries); C (Comparative Law) ; EU (European Union) ; D (Public International Law) and E (International Institutions, Transnational Law and International Commercial Arbitration). Classes A, C, EU, D and E are identified through the respective letter. Class B, on the contrary, is not referred to with letter B, but with the 2-letters ISO Country Code of the particular Country the book focuses on. The numerical code is the indexing number of the MPI Classification System.




