TEACHING LANGUAGE: English

This programme provides in-depth knowledge of all specialist areas relevant to accounting and audit practice, combining scientific and theoretical course content with practical experience and expertise. Courses are divided into blocks covering foundational theoretical issues and frameworks, as well as technical and practical aspects of accounting and audit. Taught in small groups in an interactive setting, the programme promotes independent problem-solving skills through the evaluation, analysis and application of knowledge.

TEACHING LANGUAGE: English

This programme provides students with the knowledge and skills required to generate ideas and entrepreneurial solutions. The programme balances theory and practical know-how, drawing on concepts from different disciplines, and integrating these concepts with the experience of day-to-day business practice. The programme is based on a two-year structure and is divided into blocks, designed to cover foundational theoretical issues and frameworks as well as the technical and practical aspects of starting a new venture, whether a social business or corporate venture.

CAREERS: employment opportunities in innovation management, small business management, start-ups and entrepreneurial contexts, as well as in corporate and public sector organisations.



Finance | **Economics and Management**

Master in Finance and Economics

4 semesters | 120 ECTS

After a common first year, students choose from seven specialised tracks in the second year.

TEACHING LANGUAGE: English, French optional

This Master's programme offers a common first year covering topics ranging from statistics and econometrics to corporate finance, macro- and microeconomics, and an introduction to the Luxembourg financial centre. In the second year, students may choose one of seven specialised tracks: Banking, Investment Management, Risk Management, Financial Economics, Sustainable Finance, Digital Transformation in Finance, and Private Assets.

Teaching is supported by industry professionals, particularly in trending and emerging areas of the financial sector, such as FinTech and sustainable finance. In the final semester, students may choose to complete either an internship with an applied Master's thesis or an academic Master's thesis.

CAREERS: employment opportunities in banking, finance and insurance sectors, financial administrations, national and European institutions. Luxembourg's financial centre offers a dynamic and international job market for graduates.

Finance | Economics and Management

Master in Quantitative Economics and Finance

2 semesters | 60 ECTS

TEACHING LANGUAGE: English

This Master's programme is an advanced programme that exposes highly talented students to fundamental research methods in fields of economics and finance. The programme prepares students for careers in academia, public institutions and high-level positions in industry. For high-performing graduates, it offers a premier route to admission to the University of Luxembourg's Doctoral School in Economics, Finance and Management. The programme meets the highest international standards and is comparable to the first year of doctoral programmes at top universities in the US and the UK. In the second semester, students are required to write a Master's thesis. Close ties with the University's research departments in economics and finance ensure individual supervision by faculty members. Applicants must have completed 240 ECTS (typically an undergraduate degree plus one year of Master's studies) to be eligible for this programme.

CAREERS: academia (PhD studies), public institutions (e.g. central banks, research institutions, statistical services, European institutions, national administrations) and upscale jobs in the industry (e.g. private banks or insurance companies).

Finance

Master in Wealth Management

4 semesters | 120 ECTS

TEACHING LANGUAGE: English

This Master's programme is designed to educate and train future wealth managers, combining traditional finance subjects with client-, legal- and tax-centric subjects such as client relationship management, estate planning, ethics and international taxation.

It was developed in collaboration with the Luxembourg financial centre and prepares students for the job market in various wealth management contexts. The programme has a strong professional orientation, with teaching supported by industry professionals.

CAREERS: wealth management, a line of business within banks, trusts, insurance companies, foundations and family offices, offers career opportunities in portfolio management, investment advisory, compliance, relationship management, estate planning, tax, legal and product management, among others.

For Law programmes:

Applicants to the seven specialisations must have completed 240 ECTS (typically a Bachelor's degree plus one year of Master's studies in Law or a related field).

Candidates holding 180 ECTS (a Bachelor's degree in Law or equivalent) may apply to the common foundational first year in European Law, which precedes all Master's specialisations.

Master in European Banking and Financial Law

4 semesters | 120 ECTS

Mandatory internship (minimum 8 weeks) or Master's thesis

TEACHING LANGUAGES: English, French

This programme focuses on the study of two essential pillars – banking law, securities and capital markets law – within the framework of European Union, Luxembourg and comparative law. The programme combines the acquisition of theoretical concepts with their practical application through interactive teaching and case-based learning.

The programme consists of lectures and seminars delivered by both academics and practitioners, specialised in public administration, law, ethics, geography, philosophy, polytechnics, political science and sociology.

This multidisciplinary approach arms student to better engage with the complex issues governing legislative procedures, along with anthropological, cultural, environmental, geopolitical and technological challenges faced by political systems.

In the first year, students pursue their studies in one of the specialisations offered at the four partner universities: legislative studies and comparative, European politics (University of Luxembourg), public policies, legislative studies and territorial policies (Sciences Po Rennes, France), Parliaments and Internationalisation (Université de Babeș-Bolyai, Romania), American legislative studies & public administration and politics (Université Laval, Canada), public policies and legislative studies (Senghor University, Egypt). The second year (MII) is taught at the University of Luxembourg and is designed to deepen the students' understanding of legislative studies.

Being multilingual

The University of Luxembourg is a multilingual university. Most of our programmes are bilingual (French-English or French-German), some are even trilingual. A significant part of our Master's programmes is taught entirely in English. Spending an exchange semester in another country is compulsory for all Bachelor students at the University of Luxembourg. We also offer exchange possibilities to Master's students and PhD candidates.

Belval Campus

Belval Campus is the University of Luxembourg's main site. Located in Esch-sur-Alzette, Luxembourg's second largest city, Belval combines research with teaching and urban life with leisure activities. Once home to Luxembourg's largest steelworks, this site now features research and learning facilities, the University library and learning centre as well as student accommodation. The campus is located at the centre of an urban district and has excellent public transport connections.

Kirchberg Campus

Kirchberg Campus is right at the heart of Luxembourg City's business district, with the country's international banking and financial centre and all the European institutions close by. Just a stone's throw from the University campus are the Kirchberg shopping centre, the large sports and aquatic centre known as the Coque and the Grand Duke Jean Museum of Modern Art (Mudam), as well as the Philharmonie Luxembourg concert hall. All Master in Law courses are taught at the Weicker building in Kirchberg.

Limpertsberg Campus

Living in Luxembourg is a unique multilingual and multicultural experience

Luxembourg has three official languages and is home to over 180 nationalities. Of its 681 000 inhabitants, over 47% come from outside Luxembourg. The national language is Luxembourgish; however, most people speak at least French, German or English. If you would like to learn Luxembourgish, you can take classes at the University's Language Centre. Cultural diversity is a daily reality in Luxembourg.

The fortifications of the Old City of Luxembourg and its ancient quarters have been part of the UNESCO Cultural World Heritage since 1994. Luxembourg boasts a lively cultural and art scene and has a wide range of museums, theatres, art galleries and music venues. There is a vibrant nightlife, especially in Luxembourg City (137 000 inhabitants). In the summer, the streets and terraces come alive with people.



Luxembourg has an amazingly beautiful countryside. Almost one third of the country is covered by forest and you can hike and bike your way through 600 km of cycling routes and hiking trails. Luxembourg is a real heaven for outdoor enthusiasts.

Luxembourg's rich cultural heritage includes several castles and charming villages, as well as the historical districts and fortifications in the country's capital.
